Halloween safety: Tips for families

Halloween can be a fun and exciting time for kids. These safety tips will help keep everyone happy this Halloween.

For parents:

- Do not use masks. Masks make it hard for children to see so try a non-toxic make-up kit instead.
- Make or buy costumes in light-coloured material.
- Place strips of reflective tape on the back and front of costumes.
- Costumes should fit properly to prevent trips and falls. Avoid long capes.
- Dress your child for the weather. Add layers if needed.
- Children under 10 should be accompanied by an adult for trick or treating.
- Keep in mind that gum and hard candy can pose a choking risk.

Recipe” for Natural, Non-Toxic, Non-Chemical WEED KILLER:

Organic weed killer is very easy to make at home. To make a batch, use the following steps. Mix the ingredients: add 1 cup of salt to 1 gallon of vinegar and mix the ingredients into a solution. Add a dash of dish soap or Citrus oil to the mixture add the weed killer to a spray bottle funnel some of the mixture into a spray bottle to apply it to plants. Insulate the weeds vinegar and salt can kill almost any plant therefore, it is very important that the mixture does not come into contact with the flowers, vegetables and other garden plants.

*** Now, remember to do the above during a warm dry spell... in other words, apply about 2 days since the last rain and, at least 4 or 5 before the next-expected rain.*

*If you do not follow this advice, you will have wasted your time and efforts and have squandered the cost of your supplies***

Occasionally, check outside your back garden or, on the other side of your backyard’s fence.... see if there are some annoying and tenacious weeds growing there. They may have just recently, begun to grow there. Or, it could be that, despite the efforts of our Co-op’s Task Committee and Task Holders, such pesky weeds have reasserted themselves. As it is around the perimeter of your back property, why not get out there and outmuscle these annoying weeds before they make that area their home! Either give them a very generous dousing of the above recipe or, using your own manual garden tools, pull or tear them out - yourself.

Follow this up with periodic & systematic vinegar treatments to fully root them out!!
